

Outdoor Room Design Challenge

This activity will be a group assignment. There will be a group presentation at the end of the challenge. All members must participate in the design as well as the presentation.

Team Assignments:

- Each team will be assigned one of the following 5 customers. Using the house plan number, search Dream Home Source for a picture of your customer's home.
- As a team, read through the client descriptions and needs of the customer. Make observations using the online photos available.
- You and your team of designer need to develop an outdoor space or room for the client based on the client description you have been assigned.
- You must prepare a visual and a presentation to present to the client (you will really be presenting to the class).
- Each group must draw the house plan to scale on a large piece of paper and show the property lines, hardscapes, and use areas.
 - Home measurements and other needed information can be found online at Dream Home Source when you look up your plan number.
 - Lot size, property lines and outdoor measurements must be decided on as a group. As a group, decide what size yard you need to make your design ideas come to life.
- You will also need to create a story board to help your clients visualize your ideas. A story board is like poster with pictures of the main ideas, but this must also include a drawing to show the layout of the design.
 - If you are going to install a picnic table, you need to have a picture of the picnic table, if you are going to install a vegetable garden; you need to make sure you have adequate sun, etc.
 - You have creative liberty on your visual, but you need to do a super job, because this could sell your design to your client. I would search for "landscape design story board" online for examples BEFORE you get started.
- Your team will need to create a "sales pitch" to win over your customers. You will present your design ideas, story board, and overall landscape plan to the class (as if they were the customers).
 - You need to PREPARE your sales pitch and be ready for your presentation.
 - Each group member needs to know what to say and when, an outline would be a great idea for each group to prepare for this!!!
