



Statement from Georgia FFA Concerning Congressional Inquiry of the National FFA Organization

The Georgia FFA Association is aware of ongoing federal congressional inquiries into the National FFA Organization and welcomes transparent, constructive dialogue on the role and partnerships of FFA at the national level. These inquiries are part of a broader effort to ensure that nonprofit organizations remain aligned with their missions, and we support National FFA's efforts to address these concerns. We will share more information from National FFA leadership as it becomes available.

Georgia FFA values its affiliation with the National FFA Organization and the organization's critical role in providing agricultural education and leadership opportunities to more than one million student members nationwide while maintaining the Georgia Association's autonomy over the policies that shape the direction of our state Association. Additionally, while the Georgia FFA Foundation values the support of many agricultural companies and their employees, including many former FFA members, there is no relationship between Syngenta and the Georgia FFA Association or the Georgia FFA Foundation.
